Not only have I worked on a wide range of different projects, I also had the opportunity to experience different roles throughout my career at FORREC: from Senior Designer, to Creative Director, through Project Management, to leading our Creative Studio of 20 people, to my current position of Senior Director of Visitor Attractions, a leadership and business development role My exposure to diverse project types, roles, brands and people in the industry gives me a rich and varied experience, one that I like to share with those beginning their careers, the NextGens. I have participated in many SATE conferences and THEA awards through the years, and I had the pleasure of speaking three times at SATE conferences. The first was at the 2014 SATE in Sarasota, Florida, where I discussed methods of how to bridge the cultural divide when working with international clients. The second speaking opportunity was at the inaugural 2017 SATE Asia in Beijing, where I presented how to avoid cultural clichés in storytelling, focusing on character development, authentic settings, and effective methods of telling those stories. For SATE 2022, I led an Experiential Retail Panel discussing experiential trends in brick-and-mortar retail. I am also on a panel for SATE 2023 addressing community engagement in project design and implementation.
